#### What is the 8x10 Play Festival?

Founded in 2018 by Maya Louise Shed, the Howard Players' 8x10 Play Festival is designed to provide playwrights on the campus of Howard University with the opportunity to put a selected portion of their work on display. The annual festival features eight (8) ten (10) minute original plays or selections from original plays by Howard students. By receiving feedback from students and other artists, playwrights are able to hone their skills and further their craft. Artists of all disciplines collaborate to create the complete 8x10 Festival experience. Each year, three winning playwrights are selected by audience vote and a judging panel, and winners are afforded further opportunities to enhance their craft.

This year, for the first time ever, the 3rd Annual 8x10 Play Festival has been pre-recorded for a Digital Premiere on the Howard Players website, TheHowardPlayers.org.

#### A Note From the Producers

The Howard Players Board selected Afrofuturism to be the guiding theme of the 8x10 Play Festival this year in order to engage, uplift, and encourage the Black theatre community to continue creating, even amidst the circumstances of our current time.

Afrofuturism is the reimagining of a future filled with arts, science, and technology seen through a Black lens. It is an artistic movement in our music, theatre, film, fashion, literature, and more. As we look toward an uncertain future, what can we imagine for ourselves?

Playwrights were encouraged to write plays suited for the screen, as rehearsals and filming took place across the globe. These plays not only discuss experiences across the Black diaspora, but also call attention to a future we need: one with healthcare, transformative justice, and global unity. 




